

“Whoa... who's there?”

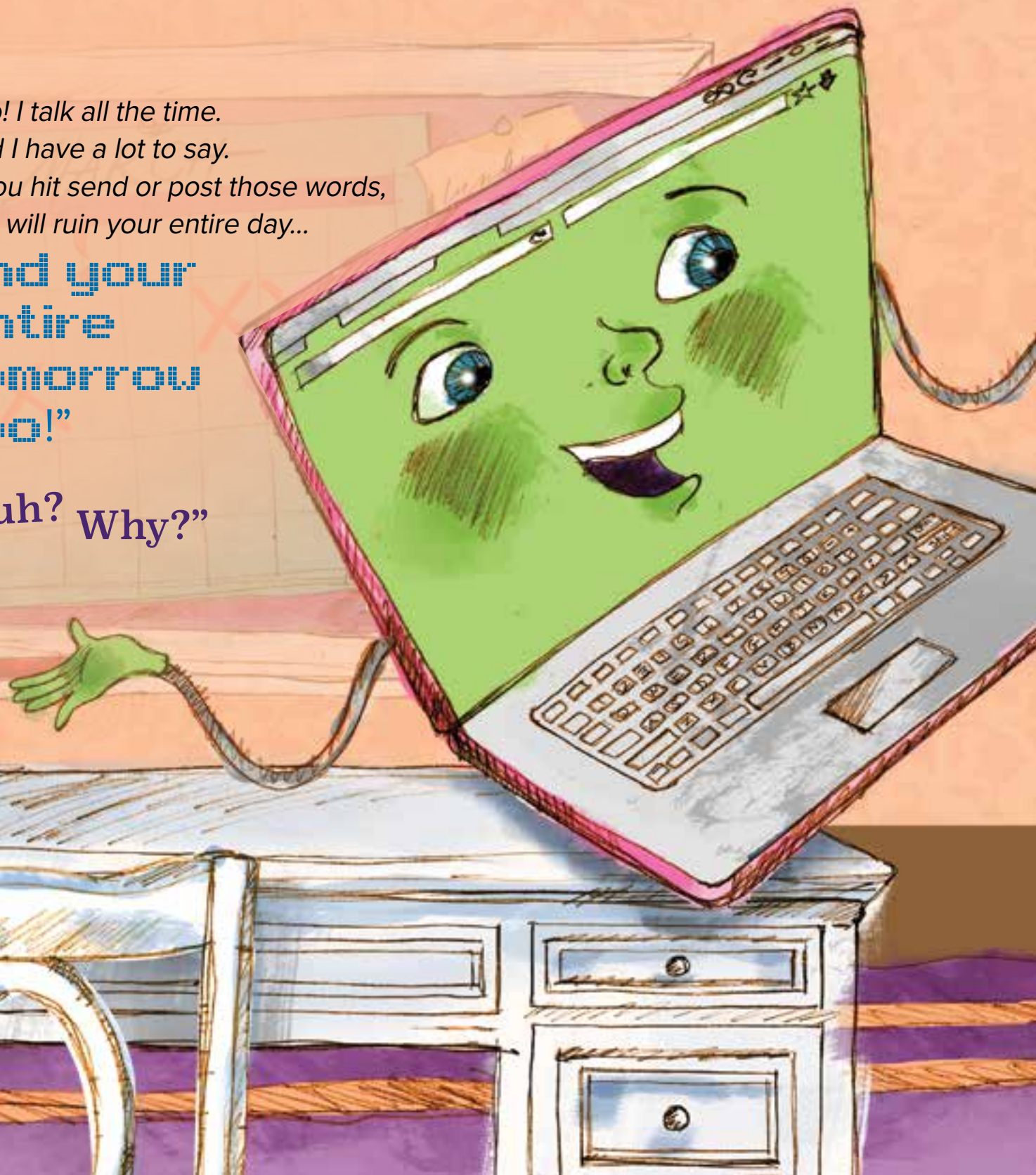

"Huh? Why?"

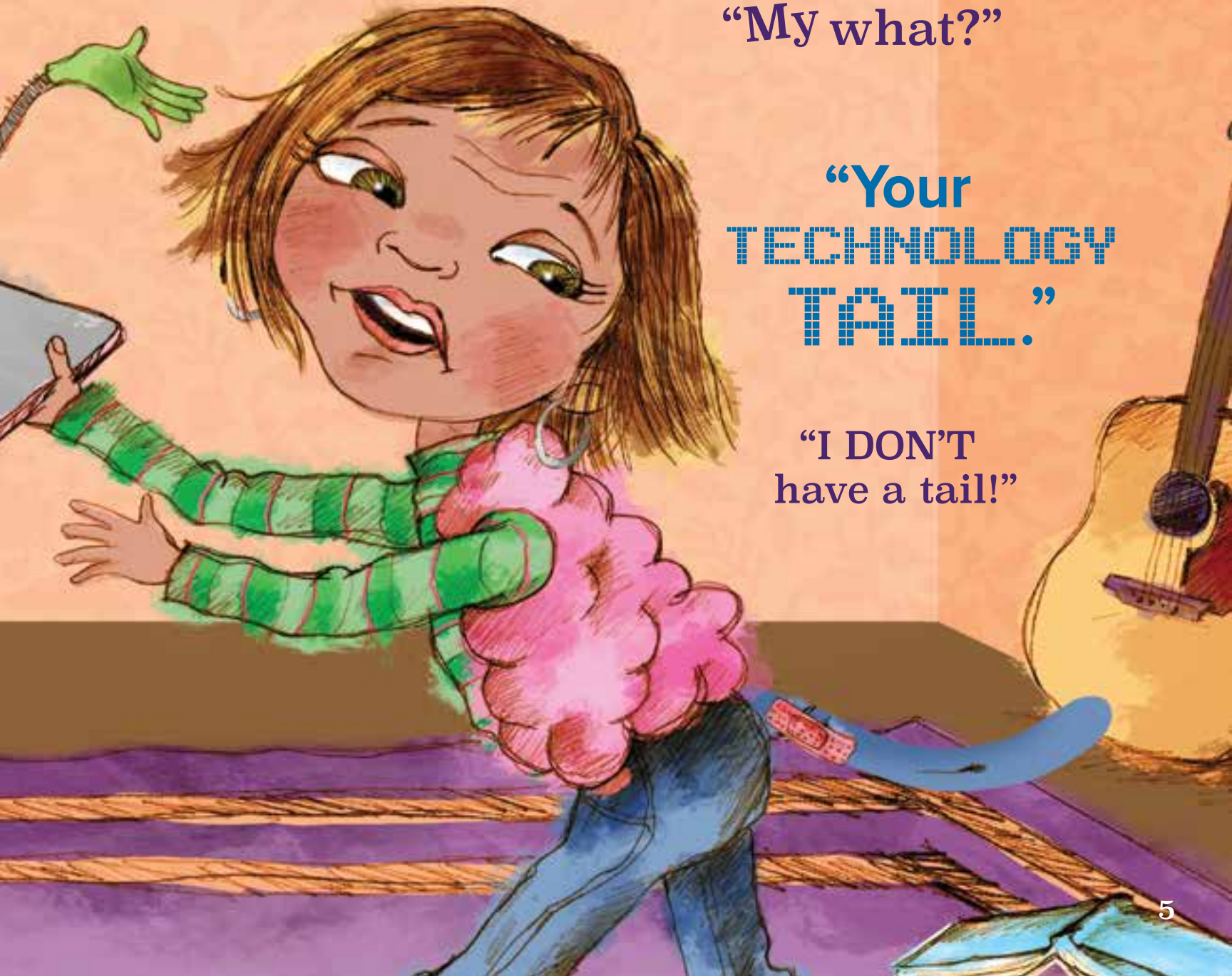


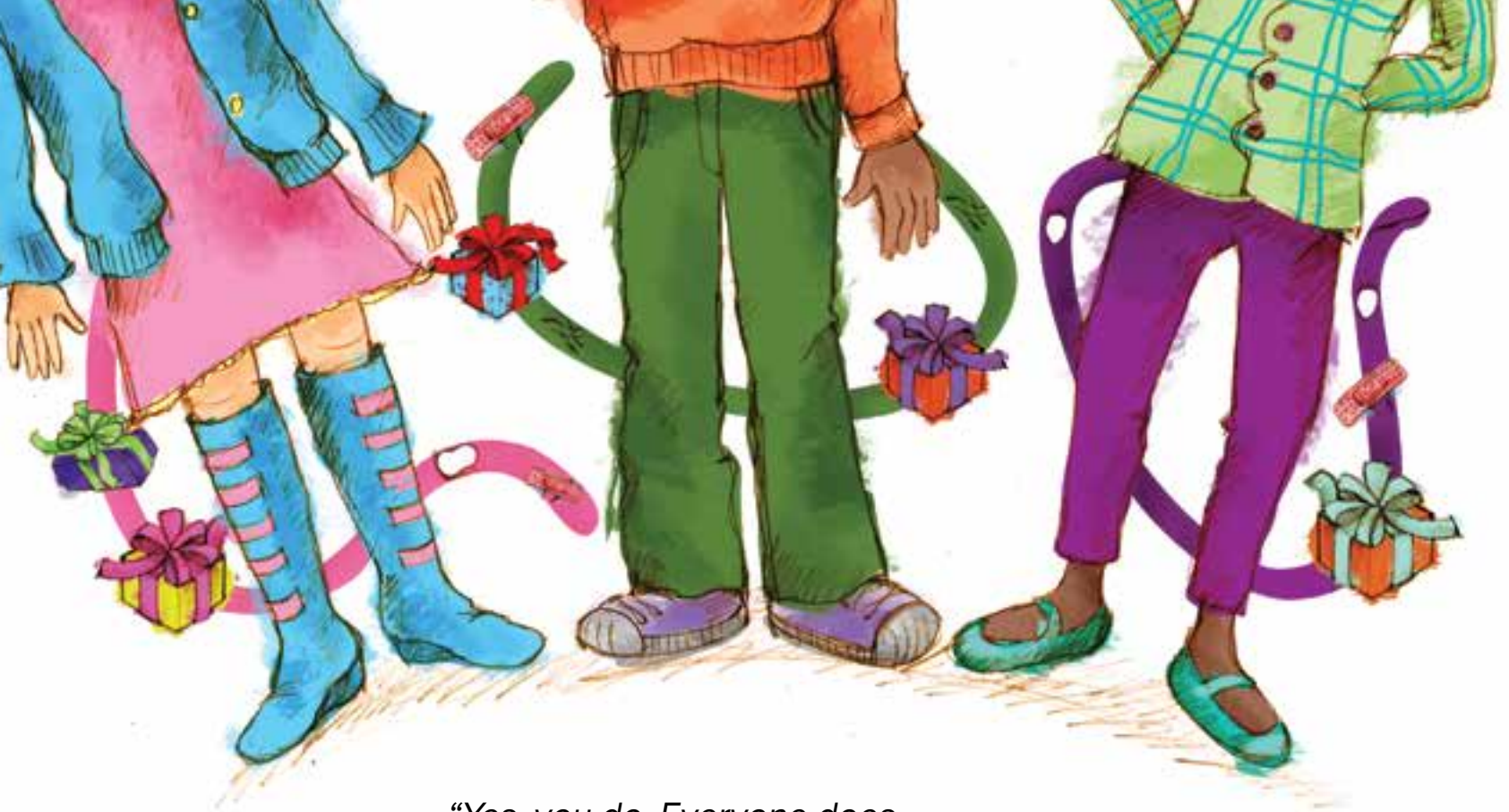
“Because it will hurt your tail.”

have a tail!”





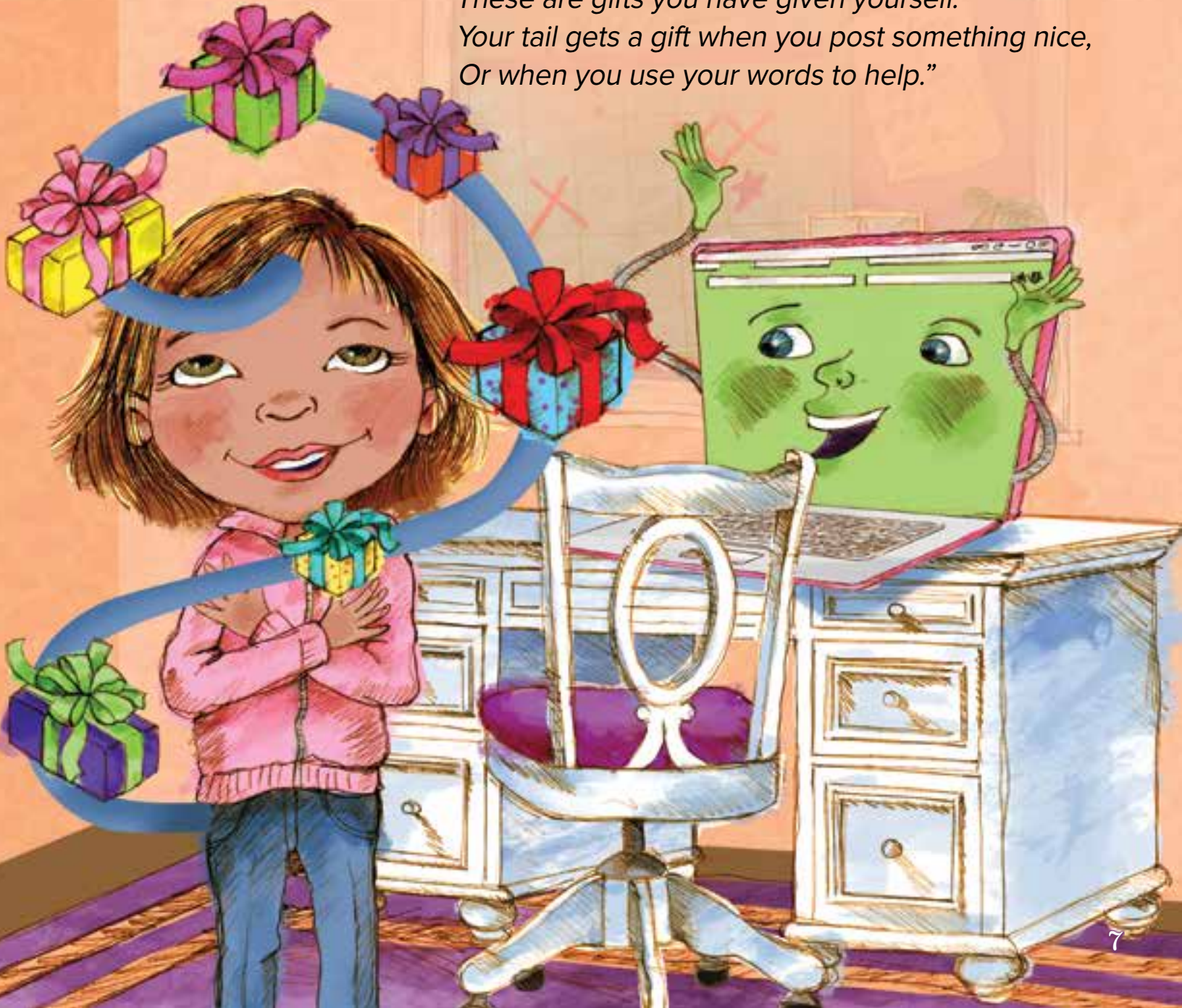
*“Yes, you do. Everyone does.
