

Activity:

Give each group member her folder and a copy of the *Defining Who You Are Sample* and *Defining Who You Are* handouts.

Have the group members open their folders and recite the Big Tweens Lil Tweens Motto:

I am super ... talented, noticeable, worthy, educated, and energetic. I am a terrific tween!

Then say:

Today, you are going to participate in an activity using the letters of your first name to describe positive character traits you possess.

Let's look at the Defining Who You Are Sample to get a better understanding of the activity. (Review the sample and answer any questions.)

Big tweens, please help the lil tweens with this activity and provide guidance if needed.

When it is clear that the group members understand the directions, tell them how much time they have to complete the handout.

Conclusion:

Conclude the session by having the group members share what they wrote on their *Defining Who You Are* handouts, then place both handouts in their folders.

Collect the group members' folders.

After the group members have returned to their classes, review the handouts placed in their folders.
