FOCUS ON THE Test

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INTRODUCTION

FOCUS On The Test is an original unit designed to teach test-taking skills to students in Grades 3–5. Each lesson teaches a testing tip related to a particular letter in *FOCUS* and provides continual reinforcement of all five *FOCUS* testing tips. The unit's special features include:

- Five weekly lessons (a 45-minute lesson for each letter in *FOCUS*)
- a classroom poster summarizing the meaning of *FOCUS*
- Five mini-posters, one for each letter
- a pre- and post-test assessment tool
- a brief two-character skit
- a song
- Two sample tests with bubble answer sheets
- a poem
- a FOCUS BINGO game
- a story activity using the *FOCUS* skills
- student worksheets (which can be made into a booklet)
- a follow-up bulletin board idea
- a parent letter template

Unit components have also been used to reinforce test-taking skills in a small-group setting. Although these lessons were created for elementary students, middle school students will also benefit from them.

FOCUS On The Test lessons and activities reflect ASCA National Standards for Academic Development in the areas of academic self-concept, school success, goal achievement, and skills for improving learning.

FOCUS On The Test LESSON 1: F = FACE IT

Time: 45 minutes

Objectives:

Students will learn what each letter in FOCUS stands for.

Students will identify two meanings for FACE IT:

- 1. Face the fact that it's important to try your best on tests.
- 2. Use your **Face** to help you pay attention.



- Pencil
- Crayons, markers, or colored pencils

Procedure:

Introduce the unit by explaining that taking tests is part of being a student and that students need to be good at taking tests. Tell the students that the five lessons in this unit provide fun and helpful test-taking tips if they "just remember to *FOCUS*." (Write F-O-C-U-S on the board.)

FOCUS On The Test LESSON 4: U = UNDERSTAND IT

Time: 45 minutes

Objectives:

Students will identify the meanings for UNDERSTAND IT:

- 1. Read carefully. Hear the words in your mind and **understand** them.
- 2. Understand "absolute" words (Never, Not, Always, etc.).

Students will review good readiness habits in preparation for taking tests.

Materials:

For the leader:

- FOCUS Mini-Posters from Lesson 1
- Board
- Chart from Lesson 3

For each student:

- F-O-C-U-S Song from Lesson 1
- *Practice Test 2* (page 46)
- Practice Test 2 Answer Sheet (page 47)
- My FOCUS Plan For Every Test from Lesson 1
- Text book

For each student group:

• *Test-Taking Tips From A To Z* (page 49)

Procedure:

Distribute the *F-O-C-U-S Song*, if necessary, to each student. Have the students sign the song, using hand gestures for each letter in FOCUS. Collect the song sheets for use in future lessons.

ISTOR

Give random clues to help students guess the meaning of each letter in *FOCUS*. After each correct guess, display the corresponding mini-poster.

FACE IT refers to having a positive attitude about tests and paying attention.

O is for ORGANIZE IT

ORGANIZE your body in a testing position, work at a medium pace, and organize the answer choices.

C is for **CONQUER IT**

CONQUER negative feelings about taking tests and use *brain power* to beat the test!

U is for UNDERSTAND IT.

Read carefully so you hear the words in your mind and understand absolutes like *all, never,* etc.

S is for SCAN IT

Look over the test when you're finished and check for any "trouble with the bubble" or skipped sections

The results of grade-level pre- and post-tests on unit objectives showed that the Venn diagram, poem, skit, song, game, and activity pages were enjoyable ways for students to learn about effective test-taking strategies.
