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## **Activity #3:**

## The Grudge That Wouldn't End

#### **Objectives:**

Upon completion of this activity, girls will:

- Learn about different types of grudges
- Compare and contrast different types of grudges
- Discuss motivation for grudges

#### **Procedure:**

Read each of the following stories about girl grudges, stopping to answer the questions after each one. End with the list of final discussion questions:

Chandra and Mai are best friends throughout elementary school. In sixth grade, Chandra "steals" Frankie, Mai's boyfriend of two months, at a party Mai isn't allowed to attend. (Mai had specifically asked Chandra to look out for Frankie, but things ended up growing intimate when Frankie misunderstood Chandra's behavior.) Mai was furious as soon as she found out what happened and immediately began to IM all her friends, saying Chandra was a "slut" who was boy crazy. Although Chandra apologized and tried to be friends again, Mai refused to forgive her and to this day the girls do not speak.

- Who held the grudge, and why?
- What did the grudge "cost" the girls involved?
- Why do you think the grudge occurred?

## The Grudge That Wouldn't End

Olivia and Terese have never met, but their older sisters have been arch enemies since freshman year of high school, when they got into a physical fight and Olivia's sister, Brianna, broke Terese's sister Isabelle's nose. Although Olivia and Terese are in the same classes, they both "talk trash" about the other and don't speak face-to-face. Every night, Isabelle tells Terese that she must get "revenge" by fighting Olivia, but Terese is afraid because Olivia is much bigger and stronger than her.

- Who held the grudge, and why?
- What did the grudge "cost" the girls involved?
  Why do see the first of the girls involved?
- Why do you think the grudge occurred?

Andrea comes from a single parent family where money is tight. Most of her clothes are hand-me-downs, and she is part of the free school lunch program. She lives in "The Heights," a part of town known for crime and rundown housing, while her classmate Tiffany lives in a development called nicknamed "Pill Hill" because it is full of doctors. Tiffany's parents have told her since childhood that she must be very careful of her friends, and one time would not allow her to invite Andrea to her birthday party. Now Tiffany and Andrea are in tenth grade, and Tiffany has decided to turn everyone in the school against Andrea. She makes fun of Andrea's clothes and encourages her friends to do the same. At lunch she laughs and tells everyone Andrea can only get certain food because she's on the "free food ticket."

- Who held the grudge, and why?
- What did the grudge "cost" the girls involved?
- Why do you think the grudge occurred?

## The Grudge That Wouldn't End

Felice is Black, Ann is White, and Carmen is Hispanic. The girls have attended the same school since first grade and all play basketball on the same team, but each of them believes they can never be friends. Felice's mother has told her she can't trust White or Hispanic people, and to stick with her own color. Ann's parents have no friends of color, and frequently comment on how the world has become a worse place since Black and Hispanic people "took over." Carmen's family is new to the country; both of her parents stress that her primary loyalty is to her large extended family. "Black girls are always in trouble and no White girl will be a true friend to you," they tell her. Consequently, Felice, Ann, and Carmen each mistrust each other and rarely speak unless they have to. At times, there has been obvious tension between them in basketball games when each believes the others are "hogging" the ball or playing only for themselves.

- Who held the grudge, and why?
- What did the grudge "cost" the girls involved?
- Why do you think the grudge occurred?

### **Final Discussion Questions:**

- What do these grudges have in common?
- What behaviors kept the grudges going?
- Who was hurt by the grudges?
- What could have been done to overcome each grudge?

## **Activity #4:**

## The Care and Keeping of a Grudge

#### **Objectives:**

Upon completion of this activity, girls will:

- Recognize behaviors associated with perpetuating a grudge
- Discuss the energy it takes to keep a grudge going
- Describe the negative consequences of maintaining a grudge

#### **Procedure:**

Think about a grudge, such as the one described below, or one of your own. Let's go through a typical day in the life of both the begrudger (initiator of the grudge) and the begrudged (target of the grudge). Then complete the worksheet on the following page.
